The Georgia Fund is a state-funded loan program administered by the Georgia Environmental Finance Authority (GEFA) that finances a wide variety of environmental infrastructure projects.

Projects that can be financed through the Georgia Fund:

- Projects eligible through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund. The eligibility document can be found <u>here</u>.
- Projects eligible through the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund. The eligibility document can be found <u>here</u>.
- Projects that collect, treat, recycle, compost, or dispose of solid waste consistent with O.C.G.A. Section 50-23-4. These projects include, but are not limited to:
 - Trucks
 - Dumpsters
 - Intermediate reception stations or facilities
 - Transfer stations
 - Incinerators
 - Shredders
 - Treatment facilities
 - Landfills and landfill equipment
 - Conveyances
 - Recycling infrastructure
 - Composting facilities
 - Waste-to-energy projects
- Drinking water infrastructure projects whose primary purpose is for economic development or population growth
- Construction or rehabilitation of dams
- Construction or rehabilitation of reservoirs
- Interim financing loans
- Environmental emergency loans up to \$1,000,000
- Purchase of water rights
